ANIMAL WELFARE

Our « Red Label » chickens from the South West are bred according to strict welfare standards. Animals are given food which contains 100% vegetable, mineral and vitamins, 80% cereals minimum, 50% maize minimum. The food is not genetically modified and contains no anticoccidian.

If the breeding area is equal or less than 400m², the animals are bred in 4 different buildings on 2 different breeding sites. If the surface is equal or more than 400m², they are bred in 4 different buildings on 4 different breeding sites. An area of 2m² minimum is allocated to each animal in outdoor fenced paths.

Inside the buildings, there are 11 chickens per m² (4400 animals per shed). In other words they are given space.

The animals are slaughtered when they are between 81 and 84 years old. There are three sets of animals per year and the sheds are left empty for about 2 weeks after slaughtering for sanitary reasons.

In order to make sure the standards and rules are respected, an inspection is carried out by technicians once a year and twice a year during the breeding. But checks are also carried out by two independent organisms (SEQUOIA, AGROCERT).
